

UNIVERSITY OF PITTSBURGH AT TITUSVILLE RESIDENCE FACILITIES INFORMATION SHEET

Room & Board rates can be found on the UPT web site at: www.upt.pitt.edu under Tuition and Fees and they are always subject to change. Single rooms may be available at an additional cost, space permitting, however single rooms for freshmen are not permitted.

HOUSING DEPOSIT

A housing deposit of \$100.00 is required to reserve your room, and will be credited to your Fall Semester invoice. Return of this deposit will be made only for the following reasons:

1. Relocation of the student to any other campus of the University of Pittsburgh prior to the termination of the housing contract.
2. Involuntary military service.
3. Verified medical resignation.
4. Death of a student.

TYPES OF RESIDENCE FACILITIES

The University of Pittsburgh at Titusville offers three residence areas, which are described below.

BALL RESIDENCE HALL: Coed by floor/wing

A traditional residence hall accommodating 87 students in 44 mostly double rooms on three floors. Each floor includes separate TV/Study Lounge and a common bathroom facility. The first floor also includes laundry facilities for the hall and our First Year Experience living area.

SPRUCE RESIDENCE HALL: Coed by floor

A traditional residence hall accommodating 158 students in 82 mostly double rooms on three floors. Each floor includes a common student area and common bathroom facilities. The first floor also has a large lounge, vending area, and laundry facilities. Single rooms are not permitted.

TOWNHOUSE FACILITIES: Coed by unit

The Townhouses are a unique form of on campus living usually reserved for students with 3.0 G.P.A. or higher in addition to one of our Freshman Year Experience facilities. Each house is made up of four double occupancy rooms with two common upstairs bathroom facilities. The main floor includes a large common area for watching television or studying. A washroom, laundry facility, and kitchenette complete this residence.

NOTE: Like all University of Pittsburgh buildings, the residence halls are smoke and alcohol free. Any student who wishes to smoke may do so in designated areas outside the buildings.

DINING FACILITIES

All meals for the meal plan will be available at the Ball Hall Dining Facility. Extended hours for Breakfast, Lunch, and Dinner will be available through the construction stage of the new dining facility. All students are encouraged to purchase Flex Dollars which are used just like cash in campus dining operations. Flex Dollars can be used in Ball Hall for guest meals, as well as at Boomer's to buy grab and go meals. No meal exchange will be offered in Boomers. Flex Dollars carryover from fall term to spring term, but do not carry over if a student switches from a meal plan with flex dollars to one without. Any unused Flex Dollars at the end of the spring term are forfeited.
